Motivation For Life Fashion Show

As part of the GAIN SA Young Leader Project GAIN is partnering with Motivation For Life (MFL) ECD Centre and Vega University (Pretoria) to arrange a proper Fashion Show on **12 October 2019**. What started off as a fundraising event to help support and enhance the much-needed community service of Motivation for Life to the Winterveldt community, has now grown to a multi-faceted fun project for the kids and us!

Vega University is taking hands with us not only by involving three of their departments in the project, but also by including this project in the student’s 2019 curriculum on which they will be graded!

During Vega’s Studio Week from 15-26 July, the Fashion Design 2nd and 3rd year

students will design and create patterns for the models’ outfits and put together a sewing kit. They won’t have time to sew the outfits also, so GAIN is looking for volunteers to sew them during September. Of course, non-other than 15 preschool MFL children will be the models! We’ll transport them, teachers and 2 parents to Vega the week of the 15th where the students will meet their small models and measure them. This will be a good experience for the children and students alike, and Vega will provide snacks for them. About 2 weeks before the show, the young models will be taught how to “walk the catwalk” in the true style of fashion models!

brochures to using various internet media outlets. We are only to describe the event (our need) and they have to be creative in coming up with solutions!

Thirdly the Interior Design (architectural and engineering) students have to come up with solutions regarding a MFL need other than the Fashion Show. To begin with we have decided to give them the challenge of the insulation of the other classrooms which haven't been insulated yet, but on Tuesday 2 July the department head will accompany us to MFL and make a final decision on what these students will do. She has an idea for them to make the insulated walls interactive, that is not only providing insulation, but that the walls will also be made to be educational to the children. They will only draw up the plans, calculations and material choices and pitch their formulated ideas to us on the 26nd of July. Next year's student body will be challenged to raise funds for the implementation.

During the Fashion Show a Vega representative will introduce careers in the creative industry to school learners and students and widen their thoughts on their future careers. Local radio stations, news agencies, school principals and community leaders will be invited to attend, and we plan to ask them to be judges on the best models and designers in each category, to whom we also plan to give prizes.

We hope though this event to gain more local pride and involvement in GAIN's and Motivation For Life's community projects, because as the saying goes:
